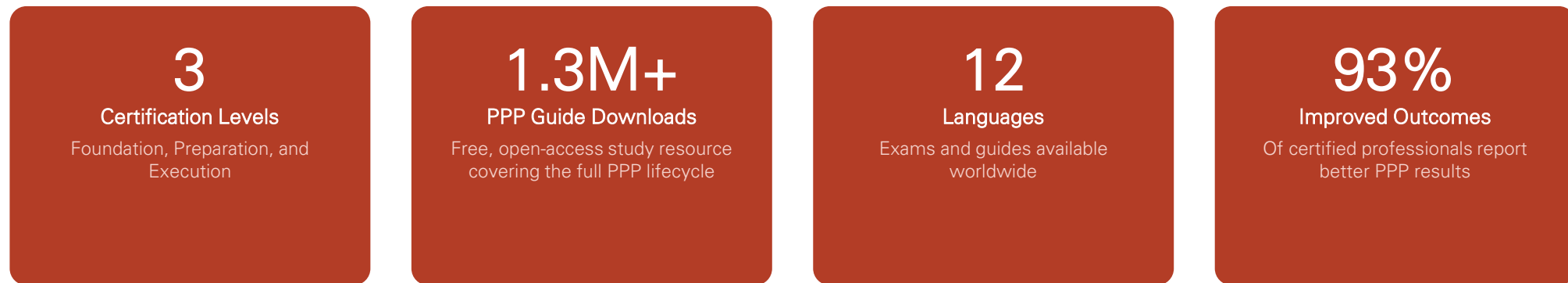

# Overview of the CP3P Certification

## Certified Public-Private Partnership Professional

The world's first unified global standard for PPP knowledge and practice, developed by the World Bank Group, APMG International, and major multilateral development banks.

## Creating a common language

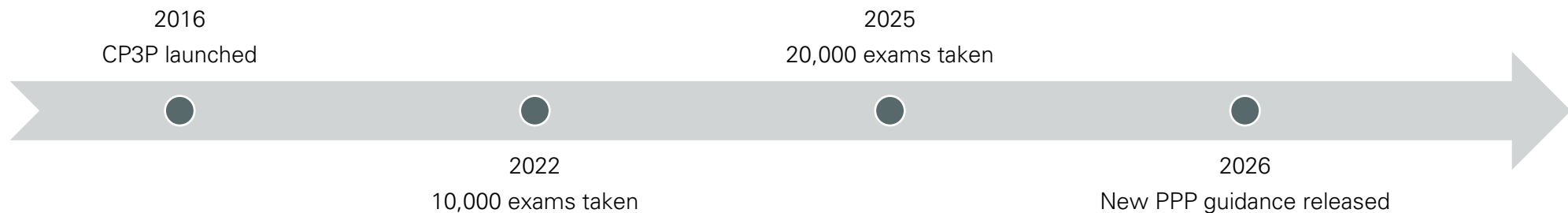
CP3P Certification sets uniform standards to enhance expertise among infrastructure professionals globally.

## Provide formal recognition

Certification equips specialists with formal recognition of their knowledge

## Supporting Sustainable Development

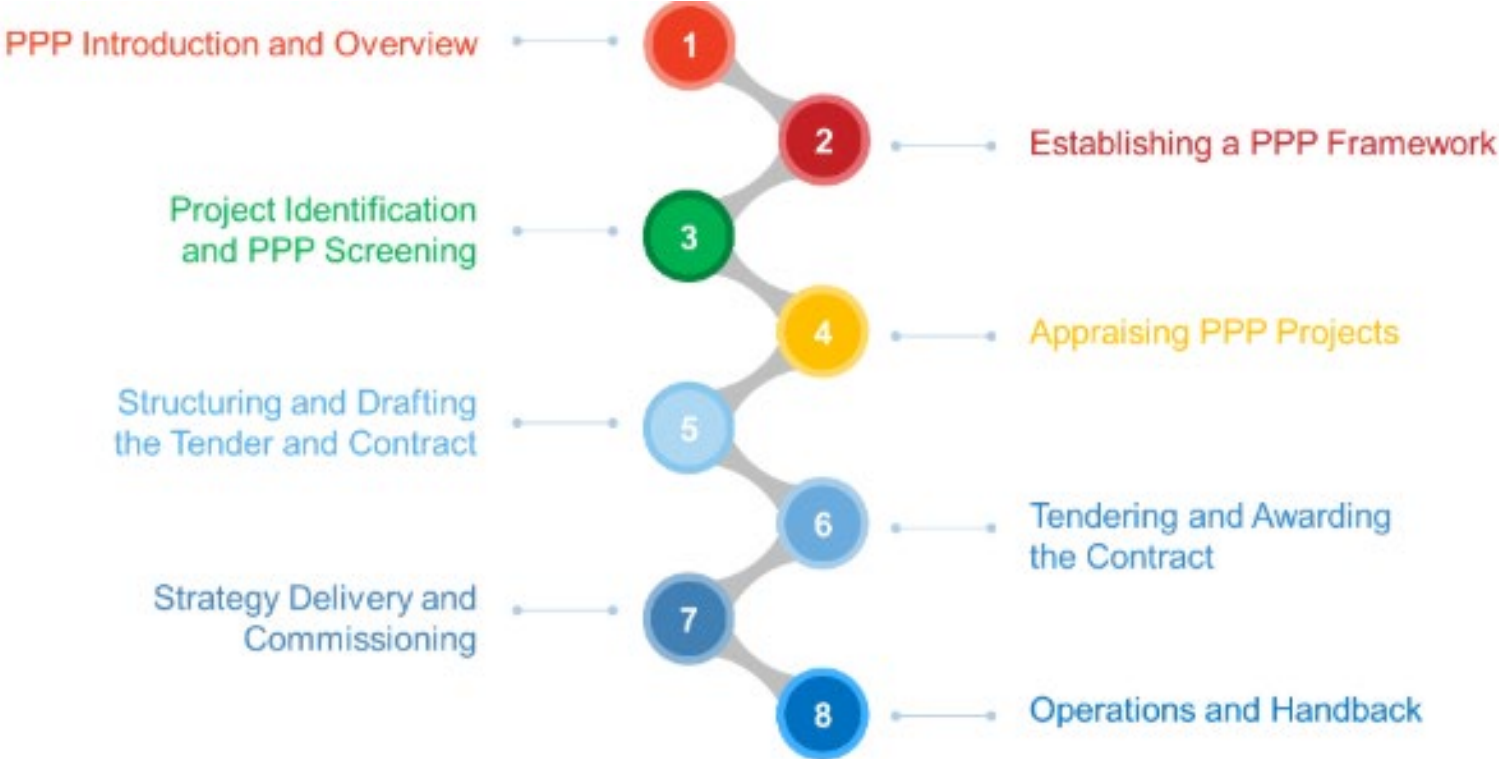
CP3P promotes sustainability by aligning infrastructure practices with global sustainable development goals.

# APMG Certification and Registration Processes

## Creating a Certified Training Program

### 1. Define IP and Scope

Identify your intellectual property, subject matter expertise, and whether to create a course or program.

### 2. Develop Syllabus and Exams

Work with APMG's Chief Examiners to write the syllabus and create assessments in 25+ languages.

### 3. Create Course Materials

Develop training content reviewed by subject matter experts to align with the certification curriculum.

### 4. Quality Assurance and Launch

Launch the scheme with APMG's ISO 17024/17065 quality assurance, certified by UKAS.

### 5. Continual Improvement

Ongoing updates to keep schemes current with legislation, standards, and best practice.

## Becoming a Registered Training Organization

### 1. Initial Application

Submit your application to begin the accreditation process with APMG International.

### 2. Application Review

Your application is reviewed against APMG's eligibility criteria before acceptance.

### 3. Assessment

Three areas assessed: management systems, course materials, and trainer qualifications.

### 4. Certification

Formally certified as an APMG Accredited Training Organization upon meeting all standards.

### 5. Surveillance

Ongoing checks and spot audits to ensure continued compliance and quality.

### 6. Reassessment

Full reassessment every five years to maintain accreditation status.

# 2026: An updated curriculum

## Gender mainstreaming and integration of climate

Climate change and gender tools integrated through the curriculum.

## Fiscal Risk and Contingent Liabilities

FCCL best practices were updated in all corresponding chapters to allow for more nuanced practices that are applicable to developing economies and to reflect their realities.

## Better guidance on contract management

Contract management chapter content amended to be more practical rather than theoretical, with additional examples added.

## Updated Value for Money assessments

Updated early-stage VfM assessments, broader qualitative approaches, and improved links to risk and contingency planning
